Attendance and Punctuality

If your child is absent due to illness you need to inform the school office (on 01473 890267) as soon as possible. If your child has a necessary medical appointment during school hours, please take the appointment letter to the school office before the day of the appointment. Please note the school times for Nursery are 8.45 a.m. – 3.15 p.m for 3-4 year olds and 8:20 a.m - 11:30 a.m for 2 year olds. Sessions within that time are available, please contact Mrs Holden in the office to confirm these. A member of staff will be waiting to greet your child when they arrive. We lock the door at 9am, if you are later than that please ring on the gate bell.

School lunches

A healthy lunch is necessary for your child to maintain their energy and concentration levels throughout the afternoon classes. Please ensure that your child can confidently feed themselves and has breakfast each day before school. School Dinners are available and can be paid for via the Arbor app. There is a vegetarian option for your child to choose from and

other dietary requirements can be catered for. Please inform staff of any additional dietary requirements such as allergies.

School Uniform

In Nursery, school uniform is not compulsory but you are welcome to send your child into preschool in uniform. Uniform can be order from www.myclothing.com

School uniform includes:

- White shirt/polo t shirt.
- Red School jumper.
- Navy bottom (trousers/skirt/tights).

Nursery additional items:

- Change of clothes
- Nappies/ wipes/ cream if applicable
- Trainers or suitable shoes for 'mile a day' and PE activities
- Weather appropriate outer wear (coat, hats, gloves)
 - A named water bottle
 - Wellies

Please ensure that all clothes are clearly named and are kept in a named bag. NOTE: We encourage independence. Please try where possible to send your child in clothes he/she can try to put on themselves. For example, zips not buttons, velcro straps not laces.

Book bags

- Children are encouraged to have a book bag for letters and work.
- Please check your child's book bag or bag every day for important notes and letters from school.
- Please help your child to take care of their book bag/ bag and empty excessive items weekly.

Our school routine

In nursery our routine is flexible to the needs of your child we spend time indoors and outdoors and most often these environments are freely open to your child to explore throughout the day, however we do have set times of the day where all the children are encouraged to sit and join in with an activity as a group.

We do not expect the preschool children to sit for these groups times straight away after they have started. This takes time, encouragement and communication with your child. We hope that after they have seen how much fun group times are that they will want to join us! We usually find this does not take long. Pat the Cat is a definitely far too exciting to miss!!

Our routine goes a little something like this;

8:20- 8:30 am Arrive at nursery

8:50 am Circle time

9:00 Child initiated play (the children can access the resources both inside and outside)

10:15 Snack time

10:30 Break time

11:30 Story time- this is when the 2-year-old children go home.

11:50 Lunch and play time in the main school

12:45 pm Back to nursery

1-1:15pm Circle time

1:15- 2:30pm Afternoon activities (usually topic based within child- initiated play)

2:45 Snack time

3pm Story time

3:15pm Home time

In the summer term the nursery children are encouraged to take part in 'sound/ number of the week' activities for 10-15 minutes in the morning and afternoon before going off to play. This includes activities like singing, music and movement and number recognition.

We also take part in Forest School and Woodland Walks each week.

School readiness

How to get your child ready for starting preschool;

- Promote social skills through spending time with others.
- Build on your child's independence skills. These are just as important as academic skills! Teach them to put on their coat/ shoes/ clothes independently. Go to the toilet by themselves and if possible to clean themselves afterwards.
- Help them to recognise their own name. Knowing what their name looks like will help your child find their own peg, their bags, name label etc.
- Get a good diet and sleep routine. Ensure your child eats healthy meals at home and gets plenty of sleep.

Top tips for starting preschool (for parents!)

- Keep your emotions in check. It's normal to worry about your child starting preschool, and to shed a tear on their first day (I know I've been there) – but try to keep the waterworks under control. Children pick up on parents' anxieties, so keep the new experience positive and upbeat.

- Check their bag daily. Letters home often get put in children's book bags rather than straight into their hands, so have a quick check every evening to keep abreast of all the information you need about school life.
- Don't stress out about development levels. All children learn in their own time, at their own pace, and there's no place for competition over their learning and development.
- Don't throw lots of questions at your child after preschool. You are bound to want to know what your child had for lunch, who they played with and what they've been learning, but little good comes from ambushing them with 20 questions when they come out of preschool. Don't expect them to remember everything they've done; just relax and snippets will come out later.
- Put your phone away. Your child needs you to be attentive to them when you pick them up, so put your phone away and enjoy the stories they tell you, boosting their confidence by showing a real interest in their drawings, creations and conversations.
- Dress them for success. Tights and fiddly buttons can be frustrating for your child and their teacher!
 - Be prepared for ups and downs. Sometimes, your child might bounce out of preschool, full of enthusiasm and energy. At others, they may seem tired, withdrawn, crotchety or sad. Try not to panic if your child seems to be struggling; getting used to preschool is a steep learning curve. Talk to us if you are concerned, but keep in mind that teething problems are completely normal.
- Bring a snack to school pick-up. Children are often starving when they come out of school. Being able to produce an energy-boosting snack can prevent many a meltdown.
