

A Few Regular Reminders



We do expect children to read at home throughout the week. The national recommendation is

KS1 and EYFS- 10 mins daily/ KS2- 20 mins daily but we ask that you try to fit in 5 times a week as a minimum. This does

have an impact on their progress and attainment in school.



Times Tables Rockstars - a fun way to learn times tables! Times Tables knowledge is a fundamental part of the primary

curriculum. The children in KS2 all have their own login details and have been set times tables to practise. Please support your child to use TTR as often as possible.

We continue to celebrate the children's achievements on our WOW board in school. If your child has won awards out of school for their sporting achievements or out



of school activities, then please let us know so that these can be celebrated in school too.

This week we have seen awards for Brownies badges, Speedway action, Dancing and Gymnastics and horse riding to name a few. Well done to all of you who have made it on to the WOW board!



If your household receives income-based benefits your child may be entitled to claim Free School Meals. For every child who is entitled to Free School Meals, the school receives additional funding which we use to support your child. If you think your child may be eligible, please make an application to Suffolk County Council. If you make an online application you will receive an instant response: https://www.suffolk.gov.uk/children-families-andlearning/schools/school-meals-uniforms-andtrips/apply-for-free-school-meals/. Please contact the office if you'd like any more information.

Parking- Please remember that you are not permitted to park outside the school for the periods of time at the beginning and end of each day. Please be considerate of children's safety and visibility when dropping off and collecting. The Community Centre support us in this by offering their car park at both ends of the school day.
